## HOLSTEIN UK ALL-BRITAIN AWARDS 2015



#### THE ALL-BRITAIN AWARDS RULES

- A. An entry form must be completed for every entry telephone or email entries will not be accepted.
- B. To be eligible for entry the animal must be registered with and owned by a member of Holstein UK and be of at least 50% Holstein blood.
- C. It is the responsibility of the owner/exhibitor to enter the animal into the competition and supply all the relevant show and pedigree information.
- D. Only show results achieved in a Holstein UK ring at a show will be taken into consideration.
- E. Animals may be entered in more than one class.
- F. A complete list of **ALL** the relevant years' show placings must be submitted. Animals with incorrect or incomplete show placings have been supplied by the exhibitor **WILL** be disqualified.
- G. Photographs black & white or colour 5" x 7" or high resolution scans will be accepted and **MUST** have been taken during the 2015 show season.
- H. Any animal that had been disqualified from a show during the current year for breaking rules will not be eligible for the year's "All-Britain" awards.
- I. Judges may not vote in classes where they have bred animals or been involved in their ownership.

### **Nomination and Selection**

The nominations will be selected for each class from the entries received by a nomination panel of three official judges. The selection of the "All-Britain", "Reserve All-Britain" and "Honourable Mention" will be the result of a postal ballot by judges on the National Judging panel who will select their top three in each class. Points will be awarded as follows:-

1<sup>st</sup> place 7pts 2<sup>nd</sup> place 4pts 3<sup>rd</sup> place 1 pt

The animal with the most points will be named "Champion All-Britain", the second highest point total, "Reserve All-Britain" and the third highest, "Honourable Mention". In the event of a tie on points, the animal receiving the most 1<sup>st</sup> place votes will be considered the winner. The nominating committee will take into account the animals' show record, the quality of photograph and the appearance of the animal in the picture. Owners should realise that no matter how well an animal did in the show ring, poor photographs will accomplish very little. In particular, in-milk animals should be pictured in full milk at the time they were shown.

#### **Presentation**

The class winners of the All Britain will be announced at the All Britain Dinner held on the evening of the UK Dairy Expo at the Auctioneer, Carlisle. Tickets for the dinner are available from Harrison & Hetherington, Livestock Department.
